Official award statement: 'Since the award of his PhD in 2012, Dr Mirko Canevaro has established his reputation as an ancient historian whose research manifests a rare combination of skills in ancient Greek law, society, literature, and thought. His 2013 monograph, <i>The Documents in the Attic Orators</i> , develops, for the first time, a sound methodology for establishing the authenticity of the legal documents that appear in the manuscripts of the Attic orators; his continuing work on the history of the legislative process at Athens is transforming the study of Athenian law. Still only 31, he has completed a second monograph (on one of the most important of Demosthenes' political speeches), contributed to a major commentary on Aristotle's <i>Politics</i> , and been elected to the Royal Society of Edinburgh's Young Academy of Scotland. The completion of his co-edited <i>Oxford Handbook of Ancient Greek Law</i> will further demonstrate the emergence of a leading figure in the discipline.' |
